- The nominee may not be widely recognized in the community
- The nominee may be a person or a couple

HOW TO NOMINATE: In order for your nomination to be considered, please include the following -

- This form with the top filled out completely
- Attach to this form a one-page narrative description of the nominee. No more than one page will be accepted.
 The narrative must include:
 - 1. an explanation of your relationship to the nominee or how you know him/her
 - 2. a description of this nominee's involvement in the community
 - 3. an explanation of why the nominee merits a Senior Citizen of the Year Award
 - Attach to this form two letters endorsing your candidate
 - Nominations must be legible and presented on 8 ½" x 11" paper

The Joan Pearcy Senior Citizen of the Year Award recognizes and celebrates those who give unselfishly to their community without regard to personal glory, as Joan did. Joan preferred to work quietly in the background, shunning the spotlight, but she had the creativity, patience and finesse of a natural leader. This award continues the legacy of her giving spirit and her love of the people around her —in her family, her community, and around the world.

Joan supported all of those around her, making sure multiple generations of her family stayed connected and maintaining friendships throughout her life.
